Convening team are doing a great job in establishing this new event.

This is an important event for our region and the industry.

VER is the biggest region (members) but it hasn't had a major show until Colourama. This is one way we can really contribute to the industries growth and exposure.

- Colour show like Colourbration, where colours only compete within the same colour.
- We are trying to put more emphasis on public exposure with interesting events for the public
- Providing a mechanism for breeders to market more effectively eg. Breeder trade displays without normal restrictions of shows.

Currently 200 animal and 50 fleece entries approx. - we are aiming for 300 animals and 150 fleeces in our fist year.

# 3.3 Treasurer's Report: Alan Steele

The accounts for the year to date show a surplus in excess of \$14000. However, we are in the middle of a very cash rich period financially, where we have received income for both VER Spectacular **and** Colourama without having yet paid most of the costs for these events.

In the year to date we have received the bulk of our income in the form of the Capitation rebate from the AAA, and have covered the costs of 5 of our shows, our workshops, as well as the ARM and Xmas meetings. The VER Spectacular is budgeted to show a net \$3000 deficit, and Colourama is budgeted to break even with 300/140 entries and full sponsorship uptake, and the attendances and support for these 2 remaining events will largely determine our end of year outcome.

Our cash position at end of March shows a balance of \$9539.22 in our operating account, and \$40,973.42 in the A.A.A. Investment Account.
